

Frequent Questions

- **How much does the masters cost?**

The price for Spanish nationals, European Community citizens and legal residents of Spain is 47.39 Euros per ECTS credit, and 84.07 Euros for others, with the full course requiring 60 credits. With small add-ins, this works out at around 3000 Euros for Spanish nationals+residents/EC citizens, and just over 5000 Euros for others. - **When are the courses?**

Courses run from late September, though to early March. The courses take place Monday to Thursday from 17:00 to 21:00.
- **Can I do the degree in one year?**

Many students finish the degree in one year, finishing the courses in March, and defending their research work (TFM) either in July or September.
- **Can I do the degree over two or more years?**

Some students, particularly those with full time jobs, choose to do the degree over two years, for instance, taking 6 courses in the first year, and 3 courses and the TFM in the second year.
- **Do I need to be fluent in Spanish?**

All classes (and assignments) are in English. Some knowledge of Spanish will help you complete the application process (although we can help you there).
- **Do I need to be fluent in English?**

All classes (and assignments) are in English. We require a minimum B2 level of English to be admitted to the degree.
- **Do I need to have studied Linguistics or English Studies?**

No. We accept students from all walks of life who have an interest in learning how to apply language analysis in their workplace.
- **How do I certify my average grade (Nota Media)?**

For those completing their degree outside of Spain, a declaration of the nota media of your previous degree is asked for. The Spanish Government has made this easier to obtain now, see the website [here](#). Press the button "Acceso al servicio online" to begin. Use the "Registrarse" option.
