THEORY

1. The syllable. The structure of the English syllable. Phonotactics.
2. Accentuation. Word accentual patterns: roots, affixes and compounds. Distinctive word accentual patterns.
3. Variation in connected speech. Weak forms. Elision and epenthesis. Assimilation and coarticulation. Compression. Linking. Stress in connected speech.
4. Intonation: its functions. The system of intonation: tonality, tonicity and tone.
5. Varieties of English from a phonological perspective.

PRACTICE

1. Set to be done in the language lab.
2. Transcription from a film and a poem.
3. Comparison between RP sound system and any English variety not studied in class. (phonemic inventory and allophones)
