The Research Seminar of the Master in Democracy and Government is a Permanent Seminar taught since 2001/2002.

It consists of presentations by leading researchers in the different fields of specialization of Political Science and its main objective is to bring scientific and methodological debates in all fields of Political Science to the Master and Doctorate students, to improve their research training.

The Seminar will begin on January 28 and end on April 24, 2020. The sessions will take place every **Tuesday between 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m.** at **Seminar II, 4th Floor of the Faculty of Law**, except for specific cases, in which the day of the week and time may vary (***) See note about seminars adapted due to the Coronavirus crisis)

Researchers will present work in progress, which will then be discussed with the students and other attendants. The texts related to each session will be distributed in advance.

Evaluation:

This seminar is a compulsory course (6 ECTS) for both MA degrees. Students are expected to actively participate during the sessions (10%). Every student will be assigned two seminars to make comments/questions (20%); will write two posts (50%); and write five reading guides (20%).

The sessions are open to all interested. PhD students of the Department of Political Science and International Relations are encouraged to attend the sessions of this seminar.
