# **Description of the program**

Bachelor Degree Program in Philosophy, Politics and Economics offers a solid education in Political Science and Economics against the backdrop of critical analysis and moral provided by the humanities, especially philosophy. The degree is jointly taught by the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid, the Universidad Carlos III de Madrid and the Universidad Pompeu Fabra.

### Why choose this Bachelor Program?

The degree provides an overview of the social sciences from different perspectives which equips students with complex and interdisciplinary tools that allow analyzing an increasingly global world. Graduates have a versatile education that allows them to apply for positions in diverse areas in both private and public organizations. Their analytical skills make them suitable for prominent positions in multinational companies and international institutions.

### What will you learn?

During the first two years of studying students acquire general knowledge of different areas of degree. In this first phase, students attend introductory and compulsory courses, among which there are two interdisciplinary seminars addressing different situations and questions that students will face in their professional lives. Throughout the last two years, students deepen their knowledge in chosen specialization. Each of these specializations reflects the multidisciplinary nature of the degree.

### Other opportunities (study and internships abroad, etc.)

The curriculum promotes student's mobility between participating universities during the first two years and offers a possibility to spend the fourth year at prestigious universities abroad. For this purpose, the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid has organized a wide and varied range of mobility programs, which allow students to participate in exchanges with universities in each of the 5 continents. Additionally, students have various opportunities for completing internships in companies, organizations and public institutions, both in Spain and abroad.

#### **Employment opportunities for graduates**

Graduates' knowledge and expertise is recognized in a variety of spheres, such as politics, journalism, industry, education, business management, consulting, public relations, diplomatic services, regional and local governments and international organizations.
