Course information	All courses offered during 2024/2025 academic year are listed here . <i>Can students combine courses from different faculties?</i> Yes, but 51% of the courses should be taken from the Teacher Training and Education Faculty. Students will apply for these courses once they arrive at UAM through an online form. <i>How do students need to register for the courses?</i> Students need to reserve their spot sending the signed learning agreement by email when it is required by the International Relations Office before the enrollment date for each academic semester. Please, notice that each course has a limited number of places reserved for incoming students. Only students with a full year mobility can apply for annual courses.
