
Law Faculty

Summer Academy EUROPEAN LAW SCHOOL

The Summer Academy combines academic lectures, interactive workshops, and cultural activities. In the mornings, guest professors and experts from partner institutions present on the main topic, followed by discussions. Afternoon workshops allow participants to develop and share their research while engaging with legal professionals from various Member States. The programme also includes rich cultural events to foster informal exchange.

This year, the Summer Academy focuses on the North-South crossroads and examines Europe's role in an increasingly unstable global context. It considers how European objectives shape national legal systems and create structural challenges—particularly in relation to the Sustainable Development Goals. Addressing these issues requires coordinated European action and meaningful engagement with non-European partners. The participants' expertise in both national and European legal frameworks provides a valuable opportunity to reflect on legal approaches through a comparative and interdisciplinary lens.







HOW TO GET TO LAW FACULTY



By train

You can take the commuter lines: Line C-4a: Parla-Atocha-San Sebastian de los Reyes. Line C-4b: Parla-Atocha-Colmenar Viejo. You must get off at the "Cantoblanco Universidad" station.

By bus

From Madrid (Plaza de Castilla) and other nearby towns, you can use the following bus lines: Line 714: Plaza Castilla - Cantoblanco - Comillas.

Line 827: Alcobendas - Cantoblanco.

Line 827A: San Sebastian de los Reyes - Alcobendas - Cantoblanco.

Line 828: Campo de las Naciones - Airport - Cantoblanco.

By car

You must take the highway from Madrid to Colmenar Viejo (M-607) and turn off at Km. 15. You can enter through either the North or South access.
