By selecting one of our degrees, it will show you the corresponding courses, ECTS, prerequisites, language of instruction and its syllabus.

There are some restrictions for incoming students:

- First-year courses are not open to incoming students (group codes X1X)
- Asignaturas transversales are not open to incoming students
- Courses belonging to Coopera programme are not open to international students. (Group codes XX9)

For your convenience we have created a list of the "course catalogue" for incoming students, and it can be found on our website. The updated file for 2025-26 will be published in June.

### Can students combine courses from different faculties?

Yes, but 51% of ECTS must be from our faculty. Other faculties courses can only be requested during the first week of classes through an online form. Admission to their courses is subject to availability of spots and can only be confirmed 3 weeks after course start date.

### Can students combine Bachelor and Master courses?

Only Master students can combine Bachelor and Master courses. Admission to Master level courses (5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> year at UAM) requires submission of an additional application (see our FAQs document)

Master courses	How do I apply for Master courses?
	If you wish to study our master-level courses at UAM (5 <sup>th</sup> / 6 <sup>th</sup> year), you must send in the following documents before June 15, for first semester students or November 15 for second semester students to <u>ori.economicas@uam.es</u>
	1. Curriculum vitae
	2. Transcript of courses taken at home university
	3. Motivation letter and courses you wish to take
	4. Language certificate B2 Spanish/English
	5. Proof of being a Master student at home university

	Your application will be evaluated by the corresponding Master coordinator at UAM. The IRO cannot intervene in this decision. Approval will be subject to your academic history, profile, and availability of spots in the courses. In case of non-acceptance for the master courses you can take our 4 <sup>th</sup> year Bachelor courses.
	Bear in mind that the master programmes can have different course start and end dates, so please check their website carefully.
Learning Agreement	Unfortunately, UAM is not ready to <b>receive</b> your LA through EWP yet. If you need your Learning Agreements signed, it must be done through paper-based (scanned) documents. Our faculty does not need your Learning Agreement upfront as you will need to take part in the course selection process in July. Only after your official course enrolment in SIGMA (matricula), your academic coordinator at UAM can sign your Learning Agreement.

	If you are an exchange student from a non-Erasmus+ institution, please follow the instructions received from our main office SERIM: <u>serim.movilidad@uam.es</u>

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Extension of period	Deadline for requesting extension of mobility period at UAM is <b>November 15</b> . Only first semester students can request to stay the full academic year. Approval from both home university and faculty is needed before November 15.
Internship during mobility period	You can only be registered for internship once you have found a company where to complete the internship. Incoming students don't have access to the offers UAM receive for their own students.
Transcript of Records	At the end of your stay with us, you and your home university will receive your official Transcript of Records per e-mail. This document contains a csv code (secured verification code) for third parties to check the validity of the document. Pay attention to the "cierre de actas" date as this date will change your grades from "provisional" to "confirmed" and only after this date we will issue your Transcript of Records.
Attendance certificate	Students must follow the instructions on how to register for the attendance certificate (date of arrival and date of departure) online. Our central office (SERIM) will send out the instructions
