Application for Teaching Staff Mobility (STA)

Lecturers can participate in Teaching Staff Mobility (STA) at PPKE ITK. Please get in touch with the Faculty Erasmus Coordinator well in advance (preferably at least 60 days) before the planned teaching staff mobility.

The final course list is made available approximately two months prior to the start of the semester. Students can make preliminary plans based on the course catalogue of the previous academic year.

Language requirements

English, minimum B2 (according to CEFR).

Recommended study load

The number of classes and ECTS credits taken depends on the sending university. We recommend taking about 20-25 ECTS/semester. Attendance is compulsory in our classes, and students usually can complete 22 ECTS due to class conflicts and limited spaces.

Grading system

The grading scheme in Hungary comprises five levels (with numerical equivalents):

<i>Jeles</i> (5)	Excellent
<i>Jó</i> (4)	Good
<i>Közepes</i> (3)	Satisfactory
<i>Elégséges</i> (2)	Sufficient
<i>Elégtelen</i> (1)	Fail

The minimum pass grade is *Elégséges* (2).

Orientation Week

The Orientation Week is a **compulsory** one-week program that includes:

All the programs of the Orientation Week are **free of charge**. Students are expected to arrive by the first day of the Orientation Week to participate in all of the programs.

Orientation Week schedule:

Mentor system

All international students have a designated mentor during their time in Hungary. Mentors are either Hungarian nationals or full-time international students. Mentors help with matters related to studying and living in Budapest. They also organize various social events and activities for the international community of the Faculty during the semester.
