Eligibility will be assessed using the Test Date Scores. IELTS 6.5 (<u>minimum</u> 6.0 in each band) CAEL 70 (<u>minimum</u> of 60 in each band)

Minimum English Language Requirements for Graduate Students	<p>Test date cannot be more than 24 months prior to application:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Internet Based TOEFL (iBT/Next Generation) 100 (<u>minimum</u> of 25 in writing, speaking, reading and listening) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Note: we cannot consider a student for exchange to Carleton based on their TOEFL MyBEST Scores. Eligibility will be assessed using the Test Date Scores. IELTS 8.0 (<u>minimum</u> 7.5 in each band) CAEL 70 (<u>minimum</u> of 60 in each band) Pearson Test of English (PTE)(Academic): 60 overall (<u>minimum</u> 60 in each Communicative Skill)

Course Selection:	<p>Course availability is subject to change and for this reason we cannot guarantee registration in specific courses. For exchange term(s) at Carleton, students should create a study plan that includes a <u>mixture of courses</u> from their major, minor, concentration and most especially free electives.</p> <p>The courses listed on an Incoming Exchange Application form will be reviewed by Carleton's departmental advisors. If courses have been selected from more than one discipline, a request will be sent to the designated department contact for each discipline.</p> <p><u>Our academic departments will determine which courses an exchange student is approved to take</u>. Each department has their own criteria when assessing course requests, the <u>most important of which is whether a student has the required academic background to meet the course prerequisites</u>.</p>

	<p>REMINDERS: 1) A student may not be approved to take all of the courses they have requested on their application. This can be due to a number of factors, including but not limited to: course is restricted and not open to exchange students, course is full, course is not offered in correct exchange term, course is cancelled, course conflicts with other registered courses or the student does not meet the academic prerequisites to take the course.</p> <p>2) Students requesting full year courses must be prepared to complete both terms of the course (i.e. Fall and Winter) in order to receive academic credit for the course. This applies even if the course is offered online.</p>

Mandatory Fees

Health Insurance (UHIP)	UHIP: All students are required to enroll in the <u>mandatory</u> University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP). Charges will automatically be applied to the student account upon course registration.

Transit Pass (U-Pass)	<p>U-Pass: A <u>mandatory</u> bus pass and train pass for the city of Ottawa. Charges will automatically be applied to the student account upon full-time course registration.</p> <p>https://carleton.ca/upass/</p>

Visa Requirements

If studies in Canada will be **less than 6 months in duration**, students have the option to study as a visitor without applying for a Canadian study permit.

International students — excepting only US citizens and green card holders — need a Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) or Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to travel to Canada. [The Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada \(IRCC\) website](#) has a tool to determine which travel authorization is correct for a student's nationality and will lead the student to the online application.

A student's Letter of Acceptance (LOA) may be used in a TRV application to explain the purpose of their visit to Canada.

If studies in Canada are for **more than 6 months**, students must apply for a study permit. Their Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) or Temporary Resident Visa will be automatically processed as part of their study permit application.

The [ISSO's website](#) provides information on how to start the online study permit application process in an [IRCC Secure Account](#) and provides helpful tips. Requirements for the application vary by country, but all students will need a valid passport, a Carleton Letter of Acceptance (LOA), and proof of having sufficient resources to cover expenses in Canada. The Government of Canada has established minimum funds for student living expenses: \$20,635 per year for a single student. Learn more at the [IRCC website](#).

Students will probably have to give [biometrics](#), and may need to get a medical exam and/or police certificate(s). Students should gather their documents and submit their application as soon as possible.

The Government of Canada resources below are helpful in preparing to travel to and arrive in Canada. If students plan to study as a visitor, they can ignore references to the "letter of introduction", which is a document provided by the visa office to students who have applied for a study permit.
