(Exchange students with lower GPA may be considered; however, if the number of applications exceeds the capacity, their priority in the selection process may be lowered.)</li> <li>Have a level of Japanese or English ability sufficient to undergo education at Nanzan University.</li> </ol> </li> <li>MJP applicants must possess the following English ability or the equivalent: Minimum TOEFL iBT 75 over or IELTS 5.5 overall over</li> </ol>

ESTIMATED PROGRAM FEES			
Tuition & Fees	Tuition, application & admission fees are waived for exchange students.  Students should also budget for additional costs such as insurance, security deposit, books and supplies, housing, meals, local transportation, and personal expenses.  An invoice will be issued to each student, if not to the home institution, after the acceptance announcement.  Payments can be done online, via credit card, or by international wire transfer.

Housing Fees	The housing fee is collected in advance each semester from all students.  • Fall semester: (4 months): 244,000 yen~  • Spring semester: (5 months): 305,000 yen~  *NOTE: There may be additional costs for those placed in our Home Stay Program, Janssen International Residence, or Foyer Nanzan. Specifics will be provided to the students after acceptance.
