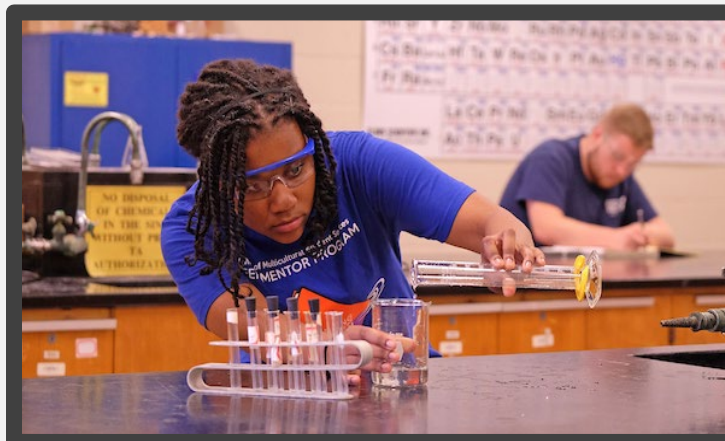
Many events on campus occur in the Millennium Student Center, or MSC for short. Here you will also find some on-campus dining options in the Nosh.

Admission

Eligibility requirements (GPA, level, etc.)	Approximately 2.75, and at least two semesters at home university. Graduate admissions requirements are at the discretion of the graduate department.
What are the language requirements?	Undergraduate TOEFL minimum iBT score: 61 (PBT: 500, CB: 173) IELTS minimum score: 5.5 ITP score is acceptable for an undergraduate student Duolingo: 85-90 CEFR: B2 Graduate TOEFL minimum iBT score: 79 (PBT: 550) IELTS minimum score: 6.5 (recommended) ITP score is NOT acceptable for a graduate student Duolingo: 105-110 CEFR: C1 Academic year students who do not come from English language universities must also take an English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Placement Exam prior to their arrival on campus. The results of this test will be used to recommend supplemental English language courses, if necessary; participation in the exchange is not dependent upon the score of this proficiency exam. While not mandatory for semester students, they may also choose to take the exam for a fee of approximately \$40. All students have the option of enrolling in EAP courses directly without taking the exam.

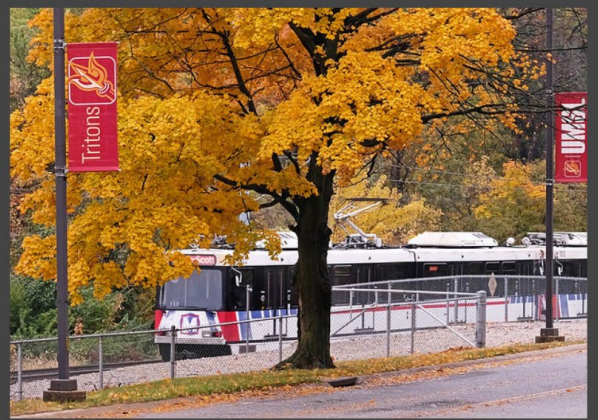

Areas of study that are not open to exchange students	Engineering, Optometry, Nursing. Graduate College of Education programs are also not available. Other graduate programs are at the discretion of the department. Graduate students are not eligible to participate in practicum courses in any field.
What is the minimum required course load	12 US credit hours for undergraduate, 9 for graduate
Do students register for courses in advance or upon arrival?	Both: Undergraduates are registered in 9 credits before arrival and the rest upon arrival. Graduates are pre-registered for 6 credits.
Course Registration Deadline(s)	Registration begins approximately one to two months prior to the start of the semester. Students may add/drop courses within the first week only otherwise, they may be penalized and must pay fees associated with that drop.
Academic Advising	Students will be given contact information for an academic advisor who will enroll students in their selected courses. Students should work with their home university to determine the course selection.

English as a Second Language	Courses in "English for Academic Purposes" (EAP) are available but not mandatory. They are taken for credit and will appear on the student's transcript. There are no preparatory ESL courses available prior to the start of the semester.

Are internships available? If so, are they for-credit?	It is possible, but students must work independently to make these arrangements.

Accommodations

Types of housing	There are many housing options available to you and prices for all housing options will vary. Housing may be limited so apply as early as possible. Assignments are made on a first-come basis. You can take virtual tour of Oak Hall and other UMSL housing options on the Res Life website. Res Life is campus owned and operated housing and University Meadows is campus affiliated housing (independently operated). University Housing is the basis for the Apartment-style housing estimate and Oak Residence hall is the basis for the dorm-style housing estimate above. Is there an option to stay with a host family?	No
Do students have to apply for housing?	Yes
Housing Application Deadline	At time of acceptance. Applications accepted on a rolling basis until housing is full. University Meadow apartments are in high demand and often fill quickly.
Is a deposit required and if yes, when and how can this be paid?	Yes. Deposits and reservations are all done online.
Are international exchange students required to live on campus?	No. You can find apartments off-campus, but you should be willing to take public transportation. Staff members are unable to assist in the search for off-campus accommodation.
Are international exchange students guaranteed housing upon arrival?	No. They must complete the application process.
