Evaluation of the application	Nomination and application to the exchange program do not guarantee acceptance, even if the student's application has been selected by the home institution prior to applying to UdeM. All applications must be reviewed by the academic department chosen by the student. The evaluation of an application could take several weeks. The official acceptance documents will be available online on the <u>Student Center</u> (Centre étudiant) once the academic department has accepted the application.	

Academic information	
Selection of program of study and courses	Students must choose courses from a single program of study, with one elective per term allowed. Please see the <u>list of programs with particular requirements</u> before nomination. A <u>full-time course load</u> is mandatory. Programs and courses offered at UdeM > Courses schedule >
Credit system	Bachelor: 1 UdeM credit = 2 ECTS Master and PhD: 3 UdeM credits = 8 to 10 ECTS
Transcript of Records and grading scale	Transcripts will be sent by email to partner institutions approximately two months after the end of the term. The dates may vary each term according to the <u>calendar</u> . For an official transcript, students must submit a query to the <u>Registrar's</u> <u>Office</u> . Please note that fees apply. <u>See here for the grading scale of UdeM ></u>
Faculty fees	For some courses, <u>additional fees</u> may be directly added to the student's bill on the Student center, at the request of the chosen program, in order to cover for the materials offered, the use of equipment or the access to laboratories. Language courses come with additional costs that can vary depending on the nature of the course and the Faculty providing it.

Language requirements

Université de Montréal is a French taught institution and almost all courses are given in French. Proof of minimum B2 (from the Common European framework) French proficiency is therefore required. Some departments may require a higher level and official tests; see the list of <u>programs with particular</u> requirements for further details.

Students who are not from a French-speaking institution must provide a certificate/letter delivered by an accredited institution (home university's language department, French Alliance, language schools, etc.).

French courses: Non-French-speaking students can take one French language course (3 credits) per term offered by the <u>UdeM Language School</u> (students will be charged around 75\$ for course materials).

A placement test will be required, information will be provided to students once admitted. Please see <u>our</u> <u>website</u> for further details.

Immigration

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that immigration requirements are met and that they carry out the **necessary** <u>immigration procedures</u> to study abroad at UdeM as soon as they are accepted.

Procedures and timeframes may differ according to the student's nationality, the length of the exchange and the activities to be undertaken during their stay.

Medical insurance and student services		
Medical insurance coverage	All exchange students attending UdeM are automatically enrolled to a group medical insurance. Cost in 2022-2023 (for reference) : 300\$/term (75\$/month). The insurance is mandatory, but some students can request to be exempted.	
Housing	There is on-campus accommodation, but rooms are very limited for exchange students as priority is given to regular full-time students. <u>For help finding off-campus housing ></u>
